However, there is no model number on it. The tag on the back doesn't look like its been stamped properly. It looks like it says K200 A 1, but I can barely make out. However, It DOES have the serial #, which is 70531. That should make it a '71. The odd thing is that it has a red pilot light, not blue. I remember reading that only really early K200s had the red light. Any thoughts? I suspect it's just a replacement light.

I would guess that someone has changed out the pilot light cover to red if it is a B series.
