If you describe the socket, we might be able to figure it out from that. All earlier Kustom amps used a 28 volt bulb for the pilot lamps. They were either a bayonet mount or a miniature screw in bulb.

If it is rated at 28v. I will see if I can find one. I tried a 120v. lamp and it worked but was real dim. I also have a K250 head with the lamps out, I know those are miniature but one of them is missing and the other is broke and stuck in the socket.

I get them from Mouser Electronics in Texas. The metalfront bulb is a #335 lamp and the standard 28 volt bayonet lamp is a #1829.

The typical set up is that there is a wire from the power supply, usually the negative side that goes to the lamp holder, and then there is a 200 ohm power resistor that goes from the lamp to ground.

On the metalfronts one lamp is connected to the positive side and one to the negative side of the power supply.

See if your head has the same set-up and you'll be good to go.
