It's one of those '67 Kustom by Ross, Inc. ones. I called it the K400 because that's the model associated with the three boards on the inside: a PC702, PC501, and two PC102's. I didn't think it was 200 watts, but I finding out schematics and information on these amps are all over the place.

It has twelve pleats across the top making it 24 inches and yes a 2x12 or 2x10 would be nice. Any further information would be appreciated.

The early K200A series had a foil sticker on the back with several types of model numbers. Does your amp have the white circuit breakers each side of the power switch. If so it would also have the etched aluminum control panel face plate. Those models might have had a model number of 215J-1 for example. The 215 indicates a 2x15 speaker cabinet with Jensen speakers -1 would indicate a model 1 K200 amp. pleat
