The Eminence Delta 15A(PARTS EXPRESS #290-418) is as close as you will get to the orignal CTS bass driver that Kustom used.

This speaker is a good bit louder and puncher due to its 100 db SPL rating and being rated at 400 watts you could plug them into a wall outlet and still not blow them out.

If your pockets are deep and you are more in the JBL D140 crowd, than Weber speakers has a neomag version, but they are 183 bucks each!
