Greetings. I realize this is more RECENT Kustom history inquiry than most earlier amps referenced on this site, but hey, it's still "tuck and roll!"....

Basically, cannot find a proper sized replacement amp jewel over the pilot light (used amp that simply came with amp jewel removed). Tried the standard F*nder size jewel (generally referred to as 9/16 inch wide 24 count thread) and its too small for the pilot light assembly on the Kustom '36 coupe, which measures closer to $\frac{34}{4}$ inch. Can't find out anywhere where to get a larger sized pilot light. Ideally one from another Kustom amp would fit, but that's not gonna work unless I git room for another amp soon. Anyone know where to find one of these light covers??
