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That type of repair will look better than just a burn mark, if you remove one or two of the metal feet from the bottom of the amp head you can do a trial run or two under those for practice. If you wet your finger with soapy water you can shape the silicone pretty well to the needed shape, this the only way to get it to look better other than doing a full recover job!
