She is on bass on Sonny & Cher's "The Beat Goes On" and hundreds of other #1 hits of the era.

Duck Dunn was based in Memphis with Staxx records and Steve Cropper and that bunch. Seems like I remember in a different documentary Duck talking about also doing L. A sessions, but he wasn't in the documentary featuring "The Wrecking Crew"...,.
